# River City Renaissance Project Update

Despite the unique challenges of the pandemic, the city's River City Renaissance project is moving closer to completion.

### MASON CITY MULTI-PURPOSE ARENA

The Mason City Multi-Purpose Arena is bustling with ice sports activities. The new bronze sculptures that adorn the main entrance were dedicated in September. The City installed solar panels on the roof this fall which will result in substantial energy cost savings.

### PRINCIPAL PAVILION

Work on the Principal® Pavilion is underway with completion expected late this year. The unique design will accommodate a variety of entertainment options and the companion indoor stage will provide a rain site.

### THE MUSIC MAN SQUARE

Improvements to The Music Man Square are underway, and the skywalk that will connect the Square to the Hyatt Place Hotel has received all necessary approvals.

### **HYATT PLACE HOTEL**

The hotel conference center will be an economic driver for the entire region. Hyatt Place Hotel developers are working through the terms of a financing agreement with a local bank, and construction is slated to begin this Spring. Hotel representatives and local officials provided an update to the lowa Economic Development Authority board last month. IEDA board members responded with positive feedback on the project.


The rest of us (Scott Bell, Bob Fisher, Dr. Darrell Fisher, Dennis Higgins, Russ Kramer, and John Klemas) are pretty sure our departed colleagues were smiling down on us last month when we broke ground on the new Principal® Pavilion.

The new venue will be incorporated into the Federal Plaza entrance to Southbridge Center. It will assist in repurposing Southbridge to sustain it as a community gathering place and will also provide a quality performance venue and storage area for the Mason City Municipal Band.

The unique design, with indoor/outdoor back-to-back performance stages, features a Prairie School look more in keeping with the architecture already present on the Plaza, including the Historic Park Inn Hotel designed by Frank Lloyd Wright. Accord Architecture of Mason City worked with the City of Mason City and the all-volunteer Performing Arts Pavilion Committee on the plans.

The flexible space design will accommodate a variety of entertainment—from the large municipal band to individual musical acts. The interior companion venue will provide a rain site for performance activities such as the *North Iowa Band Festival* and Friday Night Live events. In addition, the annual Tuba Christmas celebration will be able to host even more performers and spectators.

The project will be paid for by Iowa Reinvestment Act funding, private contributions, corporate contributions, and grant funding. A generous contribution from The Principal

# 2021 State Legislative Session

he interests of North Iowa businesses are represented at the state capitol through the Chamber's membership in the Iowa Chamber Alliance.
In preparation for the upcoming legislative session, ICA held a virtual Legislative Leadership Coffee which provided an opportunity to share priorities with elected leaders and hear their thoughts on the upcoming session.

In addition, State Senator Amanda Ragan and State Representatives Sharon Steckman attended the Chamber Board Meeting (via Zoom) on December 16.

Priorities for the 2021 legislative session include:

- Support for the recommendations outlined by Gov. Reynold's Economic Recovery Advisory Board.
- Funding for existing programs and consideration of new resources that promote "placemaking" as a workforce attraction and retention strategy.
- Development of immediately deployable resources for large scale disasters when budget reserves are full to assist businesses with recovery.
- Favorable policies and additional funding for broadband through the Empower Rural lowa initiative.
- Fully funding the Future Ready Iowa initiative.
- Addressing barriers to employment such as access to childcare and student debt repayment.
- Supporting education at all levels from pre-school through post-high school options.
- Developing and supporting incentives with proven return in targeted industries.
- Removal of the sunset for both the Brownfield and Grayfield programs.

The lowa Chamber Alliance is a non-partisan coalition that represents the leading chamber of commerce and economic development organizations throughout lowa that focus on promoting economic growth policies and initiatives. Chamber President Robin Anderson is a past chairperson of this group, and North Iowa Corridor Economic Development Corporation President Chad Schreck currently serves as Chair-Elect.

# **NEW YEAR, NEW OPPORTUNITIES**

THE RIVER MASON CITY APARTMENT COMPLEX IS OPENING UP NEW HOUSING OPPORTUNITIES FOR NORTH IOWANS. The River is a four-story housing complex with 133 units on Mason City's downtown riverfront, turning a formerly empty parking lot into an impactful addition to the South Federal area. The complex includes 113 apartments from studio size up to three bedrooms, with rents ranging from approximately \$595 for a studio to \$1,050 per month for a three bedroom apartment. Twenty townhomes, with two to three bedrooms, lease at \$1,300 to \$1,400 per month. Over half of the 20 townhomes are already occupied, and 48 apartments are leased. The complex is a project from Talon Development and Eagle Construction of Sioux Falls, South Dakota, and is the first Opportunity Zone project to be developed and completed in lowa.


The Opportunity Zone program was initiated at the federal level as part of the 2018 Tax Cuts and Jobs Act and offers communities in participating states the chance to create jobs and spark economic development by encouraging long-term investment in low-income areas. These areas are known as Opportunity Zones and are connected to private investors through the program's provided tax incentives. Steve Boote, owner of Talon Development and Eagle Construction, looks for communities that are growing and gaining momentum. He was attracted to invest in Mason City because of the ongoing River City Renaissance and downtown revitalization projects.

The River is poised to play a key role in revitalizing downtown Mason City. Market-rate housing for North lowa's workforce is a significant area of need, according to Chad Schreck, President and CEO of the North lowa Corridor EDC. "Our local employers tell us that people they've hired have a hard time finding a place to live. The numbers indicate there's a need for quality housing to support business needs and attract young professionals."

The River apartments will have a big impact on housing for workforce development, and will continue to catalyze the growth of the downtown Mason City district. Residents of the new complex could walk to work downtown, enjoy the nearby coffee shops and

restaurants, and cross the footbridge to get to the mall and arena. The city already has talked about improving the riverfront walkway.

"The housing project will help revive the South Federal area. It's a really neat opportunity," said Schreck. "The way it's all going to tie together with the hotel and arena in that area is the exciting thing. It will have as big an impact as will the rest of the projects going on downtown when you have people living there."

# Pappajohn Center is Seeking Business Mentors

The NIACC John Pappajohn Center is looking for experienced entrepreneurs and business owners to become Venture School mentors and participate with our Venture School students starting in February 2021. Venture School is a premier statewide entrepreneurial program created by the University of Iowa and is built from a streamlined curriculum developed by the National Science Foundation I-Corps at Stanford University and the University of California, Berkeley.

Since its inception, Venture School has helped guide over 300 startups across the state of lowa, and is designed to benefit lowa startups and entrepreneurs. Each team is assigned a local entrepreneur as their mentor. The 8 week spring cohort launches on February 4<sup>th</sup> and will be a hybrid class. The first night and last night are in person, the 6 weeks in between are on ZOOM. Mentors dedicate about 2-3 hours per week. An orientation session and training will be provided.
