love the *North Iowa Band Festival*, and I love that Mason City has such a rich musical tradition. While "76 Trombones" is probably our "signature song," a recent study shows that wherever you travel around the world, every culture has its unique music.

What they discovered is remarkable—but not surprising. The research team found the underlying structures and melodic elements of songs are similar worldwide and throughout time. So much so that the behavioral context of a song (love song, dance song, lullaby) is recognizable merely from its acoustic features. Even when they had never heard a particular song before, listeners were accurately able to gauge when a song was a lullaby, regardless of spoken language.

It appears humans have a universal language in song. The researchers believe there could be something about our brains that understands music on a universal level...and I believe this is something that binds us together, and why gathering to enjoy music together is so appealing.



I certainly saw evidence of this during **Band Festival** Weekend! It was great to see friends, neighbors, and visitors of all ages enjoying music and camaraderie.

Priority Legislation - Session Summary

he Chamber partners with other chambers and economic development organizations to promote a bipartisan legislative agenda. These partners seek to grow lowa's economy and support programs that stimulate economic growth opportunities for the entire state and its residents. This year's focus was on continued economic recovery as Iowans emerge from the COVID-19 pandemic.

Upon completion of the legislative session, Iowa Chamber Alliance Executive Director Dustin Miller stated, "This year's successful work on the things like tax reform, childcare, broadband, and housing combined with sound budgeting, provides an incredible base for lowa to look toward the future for ideas that encourage communities to build attractive places in which employers invest and employees thrive—showcasing local strengths that drive the state's collective growth."

Childcare

Access to affordable childcare is necessary to ensure a strong workforce. Working parents will benefit from legislation that increases the threshold from \$45,000 to \$90,000 for childcare tax credits, in addition to other improvements.

Housing

Legislators passed measures that increase the Workforce Housing Tax Credit and the Statewide Housing Trust Fund, which will ease some of the backlog with these programs.

Broadband

The legislature provided an appropriation of \$100 million to meet Governor Reynolds' challenge for investment in broadband. This amount exceeds the investment made by lowa's neighboring states.

The omnibus bill eliminates the 2018 revenue growth triggers which will ensure the full implementation of the 2018 tax legislation beginning in tax year 2023. In addition, it exempts COVID-19 grants issued by certain state agencies from taxation and implements Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) equity regarding income tax exemptions and deductions for all taxpayers. It also phases out the county mental health property tax levy, shifting funding responsibility for mental health services from counties to the state.



Historic Park Inn featured

The ongoing COVID-19 pandemic has greatly impacted how many travel organizations do business. For the Jewish Community Center of Chicago, in-person travel programs were put on hold and staff quickly switched gears to begin offering virtual "JTours" for JCC members. Tours of Frank Lloyd Wright sites throughout the U.S. quickly grew to become quite popular amongst members making the Wright-themed presentations some of the most well attended.

Visit Mason City staff worked with JCC and Wright on the Park to coordinate a presentation showcasing the restoration of Mason City's Historic Park Inn—the only



remaining hotel in the world designed by Wright.
Longtime WOTP volunteer, Pat Schultz, shared a 75-minute presentation with more than 50 members of JCC Chicago. The presentation is currently available on YouTube and has received more than 285 views since the live presentation on May 10th.

JCC Chicago invites Mason City community to virtual screening of "The Last Wright"



ABOUT THE FILM:

In 1908, when Frank Lloyd Wright was considered the most innovative architect in Chicago, he traveled to Mason City, Iowa, to design a unique, mixed-use city block — a bank and adjoining hotel facing a park. By 1914, scandal and tragedy would ruin Wright's career. By 1926, The Park Inn Hotel would begin a serious decline, but still standing, it remained one of his last Prairie style structures. Although little known, and vulnerable to the economic changes in Mason City, The Park Inn influenced the Bauhaus Movement and served as inspiration to one of Wright's most famous designs — The Imperial Hotel in Tokyo. Through rare archival footage, period music and a comparative look at famous Wright structures, The Last Wright offers a provocative, ironic tapestry of an American century, tracing the life, death and rebirth of a Midwest town through the prism of The Park Inn.
