New Venue for Ag Breakfast

The Agribusiness Committee selected a new venue for the 40th annual *Ag Breakfast*. The event, which celebrates Ag Week, is scheduled from 8-10AM on Tuesday, March 22 at the Kevin Pope farmstead.

Dan Robison from Iowa State University is the keynote speaker. Robison oversees the College of Agriculture's network of farm and field stations around the state - including new capacities in livestock, grain processing and biorenewables; extensive laboratory and greenhouse facilities; collaborative federal laboratories; ISU Extension and Outreach; and about \$60 million in annual research activity. Major initiatives in global engagement, innovation and entrepreneurship, sustainability, and agricultural vitality and food systems are continually being advanced. The college has key

partnerships with public and private sector interests across the agricultural sector, including work in natural resources, technology, and life and social sciences.

The State of North Iowa

The State of North Iowa was held at the new Fairfield Inn and Suites by Marriott in Clear Lake on Thursday, January 13.

Dr. Ron Cox, Director of CIRAS at Iowa State University provided the keynote presentation entitled, "The Iowa Workforce Skirmishes." His program shared statistics on the current laborshed in Iowa and how it is trending for the future.

Chamber President and CEO Robin Anderson presented data on the impact of placemaking initiatives as a workforce attraction and retention strategy.

North Iowa Corridor EDC President and CEO Chad Schreck

provided some key updates on housing in North Iowa, and highlighted a new workforce campaign, with the projected results re-enforced by Mason City Police Chief Jeff Brinkley, who recently utilized the same campaign and saw great success.

Iowa Talent Poll Results

t was certainly an honor for Mason City to be recognized by Gov. Reynolds in her Condition of the State address for placemaking efforts aimed at attracting and retaining workforce. In addition, data from a poll commissioned by the lowa Chamber Alliance (ICA) during December revealed that QUALITY OF PLACE is the most important thing to lowa workers.

ICA selected the CYGNAL firm to conduct a poll of Working Age Iowans to better understand the issues that are important to lowa's labor force. ICA members felt the first step in attracting new workers to lowa is to understand what the current workforce finds attractive about living here.

CYGNAL surveyed 826 people age 18-65 who are lowa residents and registered voters in a combination of interviews and questionnaires between December 2-13. Following are insights from the survey analysis relating to Amenities and Quality of Life.

- Respondents expressed a real dissatisfaction with lowa's entertainment opportunities. More than two-thirds think they're inferior to those in other states.
- However, the opposite is true for lowa's outdoor recreational opportunities. Highlighting lowa's outdoor recreational options could be a winning message in recruitment efforts.
- When asked about the state's infrastructure and schools, most respondents viewed lowa's public schools as superior to those in most other states. The same is true for lowa's water. But they were less thrilled with lowa's roads, public transportation, and internet—in fact, for all three, the majority felt lowa's offerings were inferior to other states.
- However, schools ranked near the bottom when it came to lowans' favorite things about the state. It's likely that, while they think the schools are great, they believe it would be easier to find a state with similar-quality schools than it would be to find a state with:
 - Small-town feel
 - Low cost of living
 - Friendly people AND
 - o Safe Place

These four things were overwhelmingly the top attributes.

- And the things they like least?
 - Career opportunities
 - ° WEATHER
 - Sporting events
 - Entertainment



Following a full analysis of the responses, ICA members will be better able to create a marketing approach that emphasizes their region's attributes: small-town feel, low cost of living, friendly people, and a safe environment. In addition, the lowa Talent Poll results will be shared with legislators and the governor's office to ensure proposed legislation to attract and retain workforce address the issues and attributes reflected in the poll.

he next Breaking Glass session on Wednesday, April 27, will feature University of Iowa President Barbara Wilson.

Dr. Barbara J. Wilson began her term as the 22nd president of the University of Iowa on July 15, 2021. She earned a bachelor's degree in journalism and her master's degree and PhD in communication arts from the University of Wisconsin-Madison. She came to lowa most recently having served as the executive vice president/vice president for academic affairs of the University of Illinois System. Prior to that, she served as head of the Department of Communication, vice provost for academic affairs, executive vice provost for faculty and academic affairs, Harry E. Preble Dean of the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences, and interim chancellor of the

University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign. President Wilson was a member of the University of Illinois faculty for 21 years. She was also a professor of communication at the University of California-Santa Barbara, and the University of Louisville.

President Wilson's research focuses on the social and psychological effects of the media, particularly on youth. She is coauthor or coeditor of four books and more than 80 research articles, book chapters, and technical reports. In 2008, she was elected as Fellow of the International Communication Association.

Program Director Noah Harris recently completed 24 hours of course instruction at the Institute for Organization Management (IOM), a four-year nonprofit leadership training program in Tucson, AZ. This is Noah's first year of a four-year program culminating in professional certification.

Since its commencement in 1921, the Institute program has educated tens of thousands of association, chamber, and other nonprofit leaders on how to build stronger organizations, better serve their members, and become strong business advocates. Institute's curriculum consists of four week-long sessions at five different

university locations across the country. Through a combination of required courses and electives in areas such as leadership, advocacy, marketing, finance, and membership, Institute participants enhance their organizational management skills and add new fuel to their organizations, making them run more efficiently and effectively.

Institute for Organization Management is the professional development program of the U.S. Chamber of Commerce Foundation. It is the premier nonprofit professional development program for association and chamber professionals, fostering individual growth through interactive learning and networking opportunities.

All of the full-time staff at the Chamber have achieved the IOM professional designation. "Institute graduates are recognized across the country as leaders in their industries and organizations," said Raymond P. Towle, IOM, CAE, who serves as the U.S. Chamber Foundation's vice president and oversees the Institute.

STUDENT OUTREACH IN NORTH IOWA

CONVERSATIONS BETWEEN STUDENTS AND BUSINESSES are essential for the region's future, according to Hunter Callanan of the North Iowa Corridor EDC.

"It's important to retain talent in North Iowa," Callanan says. "This investment won't help hiring woes now, but if we don't impact students, we miss that chance to connect with them so they know the opportunities here."

As Workforce Specialist at the Corridor, Callanan works with schools and business leaders to make these conversations possible. It's also important to help schools offer opportunities for young people to identify their interests and build skills.

Activities include job readiness and interest inventories, presentations by employees of local companies, visits to actual business sites, job shadowing, and more.

For instance, a Discover Day program held in past years at North Iowa Area Community College gave students the chance to identify their interests and traits and pairs them with different careers in North Iowa that fit their individual profiles.

The Corridor lines up employees of local businesses to come talk with students about their jobs and how students can prepare themselves for that work. It's a way for young people to find out that opportunities exist right here, if they wish to stay or come back after further education.

The past two years have been challenging for maintaining many of these outreach programs, according to Callanan. The COVID-19 pandemic has prevented large gatherings, and presenters from local businesses are often too busy due to staffing shortages.

To be flexible, virtual options have been used to make these connections, such as mock interviews online. This alternate platform presents its own advantages for learning.

"It's a time-saver to conduct virtual interviews, and a lot of business people are utilizing that now," Callanan says. "It's a new twist on things students will have to prepare for." Callanan points out virtual interviews require different skills. "It takes a higher level of energy to project yourself virtually. It's all-around harder to portray yourself when on screen. The interviewer can't see your body language. It takes more elaboration of answers. Facial expressions come across differently on screen than in person."

The responsibility for career readiness does not rest solely on schools. Callanan emphasizes to businesses that it's in their best interests to talk to young people in our schools. Getting involved in NIC's outreach to students at all grade levels is an important way for local companies to guarantee success in the future.

North lowa is not alone in the U.S. with the problem of finding enough workers to fill positions. Callanan says, "It's more important than ever that businesses interact with schools and help students see how their decisions now impact their lives post-high school. It's a strategy in retaining our population. The key is exposing them to opportunities in North lowa."


