In the spirit of celebrating local musicians, the John Adams Middle School Band will kick off the weekend with a performance at 6PM on Thursday night, followed by the Mason City Municipal Band at 6:45PM at the Principal Pavilion on the Plaza. On Friday, the Mason City Jazz Band will perform on the Main Stage at 4PM. Then, talented Mason City High School Orchestra students will perform at 6PM at the Principal Pavilion, followed by Des Moines based singer-songwriter Emma Butterworth on the Main Stage. Friday night's headliner, The Nada's, will keep the entertainment flowing at 7:30PM. Saturday starts with the Stu Nevermann Run at 8AM, followed by the 83rd **North Iowa Band Festival** Parade at 10AM. Candy and other hand-outs will return for this year's parade! State champion Mohawks Danzers will perform at 12:45PM at the Principal Pavilion prior to the Awards Ceremony at 1PM. Saturday evening's Main Stage performances will kick off at 5:30PM and feature Juni West, followed by another local favorite, Betty and the Gents, at 7:30PM.

In addition to great music, the festival features a carnival and concessions, an outdoor marketplace, instrument petting zoo, balloons and spin art, and much more throughout Memorial Day Weekend! Representatives in attendance from the U.S. Chamber were amazed by their knowledge! Live Civics Bee judges (Aaron Burnett, Josh Congello, and Jaime Copley) heard remarks from the final four students about their civics essays, and they were equally impressed.

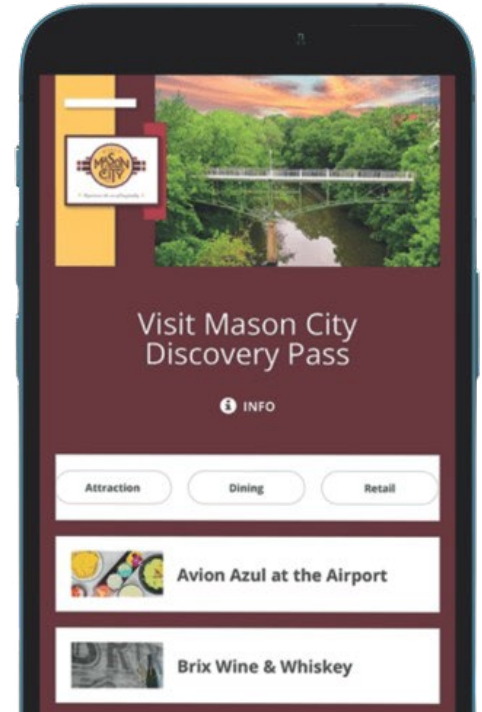

Mason City team to compete in Red Bull Soapbox Race

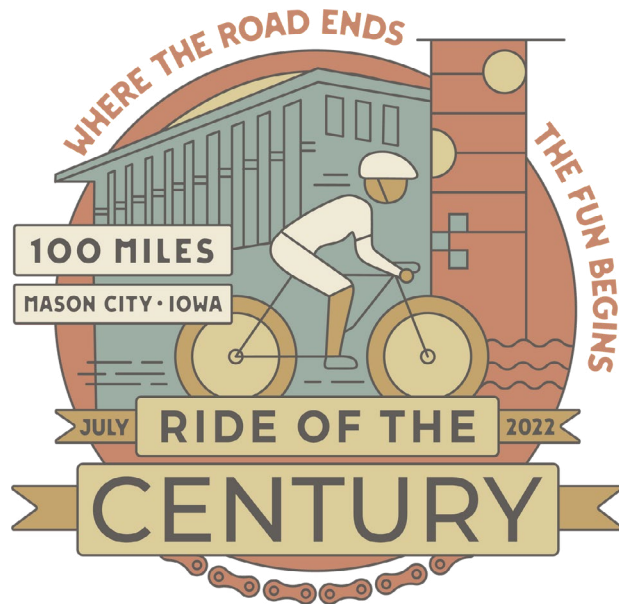
A team of soapbox race fans from Mason City will use their upcoming international exposure to shine a light on Mason City's musical heritage.

'Trouble in River City' was one of fifty teams selected to participate in the Red Bull Soapbox Race, a competition in which amateur teams see who can navigate their homemade cart the fastest through a downhill course, filled with obstacles and potential crashes. Fueled by more than just the need for speed, teams are also judged on creativity and showmanship.

Modeled after Mason City's ties to "The Music Man," the team of five will race a giant trombone 'Weapon of Brass Destruction' during the world's wildest downhill race in Des Moines, Iowa on Saturday, June 18, 2022. At least 45,000 people are expected

FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES FOR VISIONARY PEOPLE-ATTRACTION PROJECTS IN IOWA

NORTH IOWA CORRIDOR AND ITS PARTNERS IN VISION NORTH IOWA will be "thinking big" about ways to fit into a new state grant program.

The State of Iowa recently revealed "Destination Iowa" to boost tourism and build local economies. Governor Kim Reynolds announced a \$100 million investment "to bolster the quality of life in Iowa's communities and attract visitors and new residents to the state." This funding is made available through the federal American Rescue Plan Act.

According to the Iowa Economic Development Authority, "Destination Iowa will provide new opportunities to create and invest in attractions that will raise Iowa's profile, welcome out-of-state travelers, and increase visitor spending while accelerating tourism's recovery. It will also spur local economies and contribute to efforts to recruit new members of Iowa's workforce."

Chad Schreck, North Iowa Corridor President and CEO, said, "We've been preaching the need for impact projects to attract and keep people in North Iowa. This program is directing funding towards initiatives like that."

With the shift to more people working remotely and living anywhere, there is increased competition across the country to attract residents, according to Schreck. In addition, the IEDA says the state experienced a large drop in visitor spending and hospitality industry employment over the past two years due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

"This grant program is in keeping with our local priorities on workforce and development," he said. "It gives our community an opportunity to really think big and make a difference in how people perceive Iowa. The state is looking for big visionary projects."

It is hoped that Destination Iowa will help create new attractions to entice out-of-state travelers, increase visitor spending, and contribute to recruitment of new residents joining Iowa's workforce. Applicants need to demonstrate the ability to positively project Iowa's image on the national stage.

The grant program is divided into four channels, each with a portion of the total funds to distribute:

- Economic Significant Development (\$30 million)
- Outdoor Recreation (\$40 million)
- Tourism Attraction (\$10 million)
- Creative Placemaking (\$20 million)

Schreck said North Iowa Corridor and its partners in Vision North Iowa are currently discussing how to approach this opportunity and what types of projects best fit Destination Iowa parameters and local needs. "We would love input on what would make a huge difference in our area," he said.

Destination Iowa grants are aimed at cities, counties, and some non-profit organizations. Proposals must include local participation in funding, which can be both public and private dollars. The rolling review of applications will open May 9, and funded projects must be completed by June 30, 2026, but there is no deadline for applications.

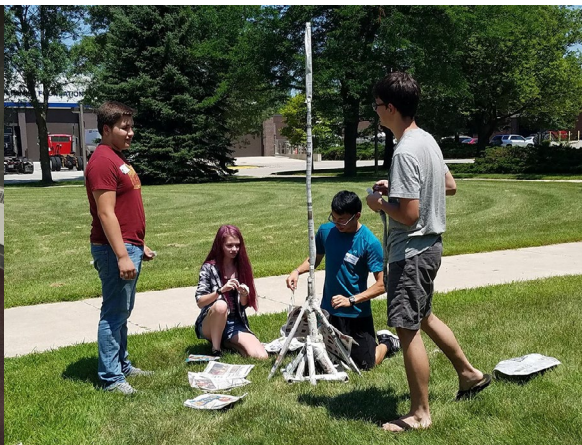
