Diversity-Equity-Inclusion... More than Buzz Words

The Chamber's Building Comm**UNITY** program is more than a paragraph in our Values Statement. It originated with the Board Planning Session in September 2021 and is also a strategy outlined in the Vision North Iowa Strategic Plan.

According to the 2020 US Census, the diversity of Mason City's population stands at 93.17% white compared to 94.3% in the last (2010) census. Given the greatest community needs are Population Growth and Workforce Attraction, it is important to demonstrate that North Iowa is a welcoming community with inclusive employers.

This initiative will be included in the Worksite Wellness Committee program of work, but its launch will be staff and board-driven to assist in getting this important program off the ground.

This DEI program is positioned as a Workforce Attraction and Retention Strategy—another effort in the Chamber's multi-prong approach (Community Concierge, placemaking, etc.) to respond to this critical need.

Breaking Glass featuring Kaylee Ciavarelli and Mary Ingham will be from 8:30-10AM on Thursday, July 21. This popular series offers a unique learning experience to assist participants in stretching their leadership potential and have a greater impact within their organizations.

Kaylee Ciavarelli is a Mason City native and mother of five. Kaylee has two small businesses and runs two non-profits - Dola Dolls to Love Through Dementia and Love's Law - to help those in her community and nationwide.

Through Love's Law, she is an advocate for domestic abuse and unborn victims of violence with a goal to normalize the conversation. Currently, Kaylee is working on passing a law that makes assaulting a pregnant woman a Class D Felony.

Mary Ingham has 32 years of experience in working with trauma survivors and social change. She is responsible for supervision and oversight of Crisis Intervention Service, an organization providing comprehensive domestic violence, sexual assault, and survivors of homicide. The program serves a total of 23 counties, encompassing 13,135 square miles with a total population of 456,659.

These two women will share their powerful experiences and encourage participants to be a catalyst for change.

Bushel Boy Farms is located in the heart of the Midwest, with a new 16-acre greenhouse in Mason City, and a 32-acre greenhouse in Owatonna, Minnesota. The Owatonna facility includes a Research and Development resource dedicated to innovation, sustainability, and environmental responsibility.



Advanced technology enables Bushel Boy to ensure ideal growing conditions year-round in their state-of-the-art facilities – even when the outside weather is at its worst. Each day, employees carefully pick the produce at the peak of ripeness and race them to local grocery stores and restaurants within hours. A sustainable farm, hundreds of thousands of gallons of water is saved annually by capturing and reusing excess water not absorbed by the plants.



LEGISLATIVE PRIORITIES AND OVERVIEW FOR 2022 SESSION

THE IOWA CHAMBER ALLIANCE RECENTLY ISSUED their 2022 End of Session Legislative Report. North Iowa Corridor partners with the Iowa Chamber Alliance and Professional Developers of Iowa (PDI) to drive their common priorities at a state level, according to Schreck. The ICA is a non-profit coalition of leading chambers of commerce and economic development corporations in Iowa, including Mason City. PDI is a non-profit organization of over 300 economic development professionals in the state. PDI and the ICA identified four priority issues for the 2022 session: Workforce Recruitment and Retention, Economic Development Environment, Fair and Responsible Tax Reform, and Investment in Iowa Infrastructure.

lowa continues to rebound from the 2020 pandemic, ranking #1 in Opportunity and #12 Overall in the U.S. News and World Report for 2022. During the March meeting, the Revenue Estimating Conference projected a 4.2% growth for FY22 over FY21. The first estimate for FY23 is slightly lower with a decrease of -0.2%. The Legislature approved a FY23 budget of \$8.209 billion.

During the Condition of the State, Governor Reynolds introduced a broad agenda for the upcoming legislative session, including tax reform. House File 2317 was signed into law on March 1st. The bill makes significant changes to the lowa's tax laws by eliminating taxes on retirement income, creating a individual income 3.9% flat tax by 2026, and gradually lowering corporate income taxes to 5.5%. The Governor also encouraged the legislature to address school choice, childcare shortages, and the ongoing workforce shortage.

In 2022, the ICA monitored the following activity:

- 1,369 bills and study bills (study bills are prospective committee bills) were introduced
- 107 resolutions were introduced

- 1,350 amendments were filed. Amendments can be as simple as changing a single word in a bill or can be the equivalent of a lengthy, complicated bill.
- 146 bills and resolutions passed both chambers and were sent to the GovernorPD

Legislation of note from the 2022 session includes:

- Childcare (HF 2198, HF 2127, HF 2252) Establishes new child-to-staff ratios in child care centers, allows 16-year-olds to work without additional supervision, allows child care centers to collect the difference between CCA rates and private pay rates from families, and expands CA eligibility to parents with permanent disabilities. HF 2198 Sent to Governor, HF 2127 Sent to Governor, HF 2252 Signed by Governor.
 - Workforce Omnibus Bill (SF 2383) Includes provisions related to the expansion of work-based learning, recruitment of healthcare workers, city and county inspections of manufactured houses, and eliminates certain fees for veterans. Sent to Governor.
 - Revitalization Areas (HF 626) Bill to allow cities to designate revitalization areas that would provide property tax exemptions to qualified real estate. Passed Ways and Means Committee.

North Iowa entrepreneurs take home wins from 2022 Competition



Three North Iowa entrepreneurs took home wins from the 2022 University of Iowa Venture School Launch Day which was held Thursday, June 9, 2022. Five finalists from across the state of Iowa competed in the pitch competition, held at EntreFEST, a two-day entrepreneurial conference held in Iowa City, IA. This year, three of the five finalists were graduates of the North Iowa Venture School program hosted by the NIACC Pappajohn Center. Billie Asmus of Silicone Studios (Hampton, IA) won the Third Place prize of \$5,000. Dr. Tara Nichols of Maters of Comfort (Mason City, IA) and Josh Jeske of TerraForm Tillage (Eldora, IA) each took home an Honorable Mention prize of \$1,500.

All three entrepreneurs are graduates of the Venture School program at the NIACC John Pappajohn Entrepreneurial Center. The NIACC Pappajohn Center Venture School class is led by

Candi Karsjens, Director of the Pappajohn Center and certified NSF i-Corps instructor.

Billie Asmus, founder of Silicone Studios, participated in the Fall 2021 NIACC Venture School. Silicone Studios is an innovative company that creates reusable silicone paint tray liners and lids. By providing reusable painting supplies, it helps cut overall cost and time to the consumer when completing projects while also reducing landfill waste and build-up.

Dr. Tara Nichols, founder of Maters of Comfort, participated in the Spring 2022 NIACC Venture School. Maters of Comfort is private practice pain management and a prototype for other Advance Practice Nurses interested in going into private practice. The focus is on three principles: maximizing comfort, improving function, and maintaining safety. These principles are achieved by establishing a clinician-patient relationship, developing a shared understanding of pain, and maximizing non-opiod treatment options.

Josh Jeske, founder of Terraform Tillage, participated in the Spring 2022 NIACC Venture School. Terraform Tillage provides innovative and sustainably focused technologies to farmers. By integrating their proprietary systems, farmers can expect to increase their operational efficiency while mitigating environmental impacts.

Candi Karsjens, Director of the NIACC Pappajohn Center, said, "EntreFest is such a great culminating event to celebrate the best Venture School graduates and really celebrates the spirit and culture of entrepreneurship in Iowa.
