2022 ACCE Chamber of the Year

The Mason City Chamber of Commerce was named 2022 Chamber of the Year by the Association of Chamber of Commerce Executives (ACCE). ACCE is a Washington DC-based association with more than 1,600 chambers of commerce and related business and economic development organizations as members, representing more than 9,000 professionals in the industry.

This award is the most prestigious and competitive recognition presented by ACCE. It recognizes the leadership role chambers have in their communities. Those honored with the Chamber of the Year designation have demonstrated organizational strength and made an impact on key community priorities such as education, transportation, economic prosperity, and quality of life.

"In 2021, we were honored to be asked to apply for this recognition and were surprised and thrilled to be named a finalist," said Robin Anderson, President & CEO of the local chamber. "When we received another invitation to apply this year, we knew going in that being a back-to-back finalist was a tall order. I am so proud of our team and our incredible cadre of volunteers. This is a big deal in our world!"

Chambers must qualify to participate by meeting minimum thresholds in key performance areas such as financial strength, financial controls, membership retention, etc.

Qualifying chambers enter the competition with a written application addressing all aspects of organizational operation and programmatic work. Applications are scored by peer chamber executives to determine finalists. Winners are selected from among finalists based on an interview before a panel of experienced chamber professionals. Robin Anderson and Board Member Jessica Reith, plant manager at Cargill Protein, interviewed on behalf of the local chamber in Indianapolis last week.

The Chamber's application focused on its programs to impact workforce attraction and retention in North Iowa.

To ensure the fairest competition, applicants are grouped into four categories based on annual revenue, membership, area population and other factors. The Mason City Chamber was assigned to Category 1 and competed against finalists from North Tampa, Florida and Zionsville, Indiana (a suburb of Indianapolis.)

Two new murals popped up in Downtown Mason City during July! These artworks add to the community's public art inventory and bolster the community's reputation as a destination for arts and culture.



The **Building CommUNITY** mural at the north gateway to Downtown is a component of the Chamber's effort to position Diversity-Equity-Inclusion as a community value and a visible statement that everyone is welcome here. The mural was designed by artist and Chamber employee Zoie Papouchis, who oversaw a cadre of volunteers of all ages to paint it on the side of the Community Health Center building. RECENT PROJECT ACTIVITY IN NORTH IOWA

THE NORTH IOWA CORRIDOR WORKS CLOSELY with local and prospective businesses on potential expansion projects throughout the county. If your business is considering growth possibilities, please be sure to contact us to help get the process started so we can help provide you with the resources to help. Numerous area businesses are experiencing exciting growth prospects; below are a few examples.

The Corridor has been working closely with **Pritchard Companies** of Clear Lake on numerous projects. The company moved their headquarters and about 70 staff members to the former TeamQuest building, and are projecting to add over 30 new employees here in the coming years. The Corridor is working with the City of Clear Lake on a TIF tax rebate program to assist in the effort. The company is working on exciting things in the Electric Vehicle space, with a planned EV Charging Depot on the site to act as the charging hub between Minneapolis and Des Moines. They also recently opened **Lake Life Rentals** in downtown Clear Lake, offering numerous recreational vehicles for the community and our guests.

Stellar Manufacturing purchased MD Products and Solutions, a leader in agricultural and utility-focused trailer products based in Mason City last year, and the Corridor is working with them on facilities upgrades at the location. The purchase expanded the company's operational footprint with 270,000 square feet of additional production space.

In April, we received the unfortunate news that **Serta** was closing its manufacturing facility in Clear Lake, impacting 86 employees. We immediately worked with them and partners to host multiple job fairs and interviews for those employees, and they were in high demand. We also went to work marketing the building, which is the first 100,000 sq/ft manufacturing space we have had available in years. There was significant interest, and Serta has accepted an offer on the facility. We are working through the purchase with both parties, as well as putting assistance together from the City of Clear Lake and Iowa Economic Development Authority. The new business will create about 36 new jobs in the first 2 years, with potential for more in the coming years.

In addition to the phenomenal success of our local businesses, the Corridor has continued to have strong interest from businesses interested in expanding into the region. The primary sector has been in the bio-renewable fuel industry, as we are currently working with **3** major projects interested in our region. Each is in the due diligence and pre-engineering phase, and we are working towards final decisions from each by the start of 2023.

The region has also seen significant interest and development in the retail sector. The Corridor generally does not focus on retail recruitment, but due to increased demand we have provided assistance to multiple inquiries recently. The Corridor assisted the new **Old Navy**, **Ross**, and **Five Below** stores in their selection of the Willow Creek Crossing location in Mason City. These national chains will fill 3 vacant store fronts, including half of the former Best Buy. In addition, **O'Reilly's** and **Dollar General's** new stores are largely constructed in the former Sears parking lot, with openings before the end of the year.


We are currently working on providing potential location information to 3 other regional and national retail chains in Mason City and Clear Lake as well. Retail interest in our region is a great indicator of a strong local economy, as retail goes where the customers and dollars are. When they see strong prospects in an area, it shows that they believe we are positioned well for success. In the current national economic climate, that is really encouraging news for the health and vibrancy of North Iowa.

Kudos to Cargill -Changing Lives

Cargill is changing the lives of more than 100 students and families through a gift of 100 PCs and 100 internet hotspots. When the pandemic revealed the difficulties of online learning for families without internet access or sufficient computers for their children, the company took action. Working with the nonprofit organization PCs4People, the company distributed desktop computers and internet hotspots in each of its plant locations.

Locally, the Chamber assisted Cargill in providing 60 PCs and hotspots to Newman Catholic Schools and distributed the remaining 40 sets to area youth through the Mason City Parks & Recreation Department and 43 North Iowa.

Plant Manager Jessica Reith said, "We're proud of our company for identifying a need and taking action. This gift will be a gamechanger for these students and their families."
