Sled Donations for YIELD Project

Each year, **YIELD** students complete a Community Impact Project as a graduation requirement. This year, the class wanted to tackle a timely project that would be fun for kids in lowa winters. After reviewing a variety of ideas, they found a "free sled library" concept that had been implemented in other communities. Not only will this offer a fun winter activity for North lowans, but it will help provide sleds to visitors or to those who may not already have access.

The students researched other cities with sled libraries for opinions and best practices. They also consulted with Mason City city staff and presented their project to the Mason City Park Board for approval of installation of two sled racks – one at the East Park Sledding Hill and one at the Georgia Hanford Sledding Hill. Students will construct the sled "shed" racks with assistance from the Mason City High School woods shop instructor and will work with city staff to make sure sleds are stocked in the racks and that broken sleds are removed from the sites.

YIELD students are seeking gently used sleds or monetary donations to purchase new sleds for the project. Various forms of sleds/saucers are welcome, however, any with metal runners will not be accepted. Donations can be dropped off at the Commerce Center in Mason City (9 N Federal Ave) between 8AM-4:30PM Monday-Friday until December 14. The Sled Sheds will be installed by late December.



QUALITY OF LIFE PROJECTS TAKE ACTION

A RECENT INCREASE IN COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT PROJECTS for North Iowa will benefit current and prospective residents. "Our communities are really on the move," said Chad Schreck, President & CEO of North Iowa Corridor Economic Development Corporation. "It ties back to the Vision North Iowa plan developed about five years ago. Those discussions made it clear that local businesses and citizens wanted to see more amenities and housing. With planning and input, we're now seeing great progress. We've been working to make it happen, and these are the results."

Schreck said he's appreciative of city and county leadership for making all these decisions, which involved lots of time and investment. In October 2022, Mason City and Cerro Gordo County were awarded \$4.5 million towards a large-scale plan to improve outdoor recreation here. The funds came from the Destination lowa grant program through the lowa Economic Development Corporation (IEDA). Gov. Kim Reynolds earmarked \$100 million from the federal American Rescue Plan Act for "transformational" projects to encourage tourism and boost the quality of life in the state.

Officials worked with members of North Iowa Human Powered Trails and Mason City Activity Living and Transportation Commission to develop the Bike North Iowa plan, which aims to make this region a biking tourism destination. Proposed improvements include construction of more single track trails; a bike park and pump track for mountain biking; connections between existing city and county trails; trailside amenities; and improvements to a rural campground on the Prairieland Trail. The total plan is estimated to cost almost \$12 million over the next two years.

The City of Clear Lake is expecting to hear before the end of the year whether it secured its own Destination lowa grant, with a Surf District redevelopment plan to capitalize on the tourism draw of the Surf Ballroom and the lake.

The list of other current and ongoing development projects in the area continues:

- Groundbreaking took place recently on "River II," a second Talon Development housing project adding 93 units in downtown Mason City. Schreck said Talon's first complex here has been at or near-capacity since opening in 2020. Residents typically include young professionals, employees of city businesses, and older people who have downsized housing, according to Schreck.

- DEV Partners is working with the city on a new 11-unit row home project on an empty lot at the corner of N. Federal and 2nd St NW, and received an IEDA Workforce Housing Tax Credits in September.

- Renovations are creating upper-story apartments in downtown areas, including above Simply Nourished and Edward Jones Investments in Mason City and above Charlie's Soda Fountain in Clear Lake.

- Groundbreaking for the "Everybody Plays" playground was held in Clear Lake this fall, to construct an accessible, all-inclusive park for families.

- Groundwork is underway at Emerald Edge, a development near Interstate 35 in Clear Lake that will include housing around a new Hy-Vee grocery and gas station.

- Ridge Development is building 8 twin homes and 16 single-family houses on property just north of Clear Lake State Park.

- Mason City is moving forward on a RiverWalk along Willow Creek, connecting east and west sides of town, after receiving several state and private grants.

- Footings are going in for a new terminal building at Mason City Airport.

- Clear Lake's new Wellness Center and Mason City Schools' addition of a field house and natatorium in the past year add to the area's amenities.

"As people look at communities to decide where to live, people want recreational amenities, they want a high quality of life," Schreck said. "Every person lives someplace for a different reason, but this is what most people look for, at a bare minimum. And they need options in housing types. We need all types, because people want to be able to choose."

An update of the Vision North Iowa county-wide comprehensive plan has begun, and opportunities for public input will be provided with initial public workshops December 7th and 8th.

"We know businesses need help with recruiting. Our communities have great quality of life and low cost of living, and are committed to continuing to improve it. And to keep people here, we also need good schools, government, and businesses. We're proud of the collaboration our organizations and communities have built up, and are excited by the results."

North Iowa Businesses Compete in Fall 2022 Venture School Launch Day

The NIACC John Pappajohn Entrepreneurial Center hosted Venture School Launch Day on Thursday, November 17, 2022. The Fall 2022 Venture School cohort competed in person after attending classes virtually for 7 weeks of training, customer discovery, and developing their business model alongside local entrepreneur coaches. A panel of local judges selected First, Second, and Third Place winners, and two Honorable Mention awards.

First Place – Bethany Fisher, Trendy Pineapple Boutique, Garner, IA. Awarded \$1,500 prize.

Second Place – Brittany Bock, A Kneaded Break, Charles City, IA. Awarded \$1000 prize.

Third Place – Davin McLeod and Jared Herrmann, WhiteGlove, Mason City, IA. Awarded \$500 prize.

Honorable Mention – Kole Witte, Northern Roots Landscaping, Manly IA; and Michael Hook, Elegant Countertops, Garner, IA. Awarded \$250 prize.

The University of Iowa Venture School is a premier statewide program for entrepreneurs and is built from a streamlined curriculum developed by the National Science Foundation I-Corps at Stanford University and the University of California, Berkeley. Venture School emphasizes real-world entrepreneurship and innovation based on leading edge curriculum. Teams will accelerate the startup process by testing their business model

They get out of the building to talk to customers, partners, and competitors, rather than relying on statistics and secondhand market research.

Each team is assigned a local entrepreneur as their coach. On Launch Day, participants compete for seed money with the top team winning \$1,500. In addition, eligible teams may compete for cash awards at the state level during the Venture School Launch Day at EntreFEST in Iowa City on June 8-9, 2023. The cost for the course is \$299. Human Trafficking During the Holidays

While it's sobering to think about, human traffickers don't take a break during the holiday season. In the coming weeks, millions of travelers will be passing through areas where labor and sex trafficking could be occurring, such as hotels/motels, rest stops, gas stations, and restaurants. In 2020, the Iowa Attorney General's office identified 558 sex trafficking victims and 158 labor trafficking victims.

Iowa Businesses Against Trafficking (IBAT) is a statewide recognition and education initiative from the Iowa Secretary of State's office. IBAT strives to empower businesses to help in the fight to end human trafficking in Iowa through trainings and outreach. By joining, businesses are committing to **Learn Something** about human trafficking and **Do Something** to educate their community on this horrific crime. Since its launch on January 13, 2022 they've had **over 600 businesses become a member of IBAT**, and all Chamber members are invited to join.
