2nd Annual North Iowa Civics Bee

Mason City middle school students who can show their knowledge and enthusiasm for civics will have a chance to win recognition and prizes in the *North Iowa Civics Bee* sponsored by Thrivent - Todd Leet.

Mason City is one of five regional Civics Bees happening across lowa this spring as part of a national initiative of the U.S. Chamber of Commerce Foundation. The program aims to increase literacy about American civic life. The Civics Bee is designed to give young Americans a taste of how they can contribute and participate in our government process. The North Iowa Civics Bee will take place this spring, with the finalists moving on to the Iowa Civics Bee. Middle school students will participate in a first-round essay competition on civics. From those participants, local judges will choose ten students to participate in the final round: a live guiz event testing their civics knowledge.

Studies have shown a decline in civics education nationwide in recent years that has coincided with waning civics literacy, dwindling trust in a range of public institutions, and an intensifying polarization among various segments of Americans. In a recent survey, only 56% of Americans could name all three branches of government. A shocking 20% could not name a single branch.

Modeled on annual spelling bees that occur across the U.S., the National Civics Bee is designed to be a first step in reacquainting Americans with civics education. Chamber President Colleen Frein is working in conjunction with Mason City Community Schools to present this program, but students from across North Iowa are invited to participate.





MAKING A POSITIVE IMPACT IN DOWNTOWN MASON CITY

Since 2003, Main Street Mason City has been working to promote, preserve, and enhance Downtown Mason City as a diverse business, cultural, residential, and entertainment destination for the benefit of the entire community. A nationally accredited Main Street program, MSMC utilizes the Four Point Approach® to make a positive impact in downtown Mason City - Organization, Economic Vitality, Design, and Promotion.

ORGANIZATION: The Board of Directors gets everyone working toward the same goals and assembles the human and financial resources to implement the Main Street Mason City program. Working with staff, the board makes up the fundamental organizational structure of MSMC's volunteer-driven program. It strives to build consensus and cooperation among the various stakeholders: individual businesses, government entities, residents, nonprofits, and interested citizens. The board steers the organization and coordinates the activities of the other committees.

ECONOMIC VITALITY: The Economic Vitality Committee is dedicated to strengthening existing economic assets while expanding and diversifying the economic base in downtown Mason City. The committee works to create an environment that encourages business retention, attraction, and growth. Quality building rehabilitation and upper story development and activation are key strategies, since converting under-used space into economically productive property helps boost the value of the downtown district.

DESIGN: The Design Committee works to create an attractive, coordinated and quality image of the downtown district. It concentrates on our great physical assets: a wealth of historic buildings, an attractive geographic setting, and pedestrian-oriented streets. The Design Committee encourages building preservation and maintenance through grant programs and design assistance from Main Street Iowa, the statewide coordinating agency. In addition, the committee promotes Downtown beautification with flower planting, clean-up campaigns, and holiday decorations.

PROMOTION: MSMC's Promotions Committee fosters a positive image of downtown and encourages people to live, work, play, and invest here. The committee promotes downtown businesses and organizes events to bring people downtown—and give them reasons to keep returning. Activities such as the Brew to Brew Bike Ride, Haunted Historic Building Tour, Home for the Holidays, Run with Rudolph, Jingle Mingle Pub Crawl and retail events promote commercial activity and investment in downtown.

THE NORTH IOWA JOINT COMPREHENSIVE PLAN

THE NORTH IOWA CORRIDOR strives to create a collaborative approach to the growth and prosperity of North Iowa. One of the best ways to do that is through coordinated strategic planning with our partner communities and stakeholders. With that in mind, we have teamed up with the Cities of Mason City and Clear Lake, and Cerro Gordo County to develop a Joint Comprehensive Plan to guide the long-term planning for the region's future growth and prosperity.

This cooperative planning approach will best serve the entire region, as each local body will create its own specific plan, but work together with the bigger picture in mind, recognizing that growth or decline within one jurisdiction influences development in the others. Our consultants, RDG Planning & Design, are guiding the process and developing the plan with the support of our Joint Planning Committee, made up of representatives of all 3 jurisdictions.

A comprehensive plan focuses on creating a shared vision of the future, finding solutions to current problems, and providing a guide to realize the vision. It has been over 10 years since any of the partners have completed their individual plans. During the Vision North Iowa Economic Development Strategic Planning effort in 2017, a key goal identified was to develop a joint comprehensive plan with each partner to better unite the local government strategies for long-term, sustainable success.

Key Plan Elements:

- Land use plans for the unincorporated areas of the county, Clear Lake, and Mason City
- · Transportation and mobility choices
- · Park, trail, natural area, and greenway locations and enhancements
- Housing and neighborhood conservation policy
- · Community facilities and public infrastructure needs
- Community character enhancements

SCAN ME FOR MORE INFO

One of the primary goals of this effort is to provide frequent opportunities for citizens and businesses of our communities to be involved and help us to create this long-range plan and the community's goals for development, growth, services, and preservation. So far there have been numerous focus group meetings, and two public workshops were held in December to gather feedback and input from the community. There will be several more public sessions in January, February, and March.

Several common themes have been identified throughout the input sessions, including such priorities as the appearance of important community corridors (Hwy 18, Hwy 122 4th Ave/255th St), growth and development, housing, recreation and amenities, population/workforce, and more.

In addition to the public meetings, residents can learn more about the planning process, and provide input via an online survey and interactive map that can be found at https://rdgusa.mysocialpinpoint.com/north-iowa-corridor-plan (or scan the QR code above). The map offers the ability to note specific areas in the communities or county to make suggestions or identify concerns. Please check it out, and encourage your friends and neighbors to participate as well.

Following the public input sessions, the planning team will be compiling all the information and develop a draft plan. Further opportunities for public review and input will then be offered early this summer, with a target of July for final approvals from each jurisdiction.

Venture School Takes New Entrepreneurs to the Next Level

Register now for Spring 2023

The NIACC John Pappajohn Entrepreneurial Center is now accepting applications for the Spring 2023 cohort of the University of Iowa Venture School program. The Spring 2023 program will be held as a hybrid in-person/online on Thursday evenings, and will begin with an in-person orientation session on Wednesday, February 15.

U of I Venture School is the premier statewide program for entrepreneurs and is built from a streamlined curriculum developed by the National Science Foundation I-Corps at Stanford University and the University of California, Berkeley. Venture School emphasizes real-world entrepreneurship and innovation based on a leading-edge curriculum. Participants will

encounter the chaos and uncertainty of creating new ventures based on customer discovery.

The Spring 2023 Venture School program will be held as a hybrid class. An in-person orientation will be held Wednesday, February 15 to explain the course expectations and to meet the coaches. Following classes will be held via Zoom on Wednesdays, February 22 – April 5, 5:30-9:00pm. The Launch Day Pitch Competition will be held in-person on the NIACC campus on Wednesday, April 12, 2023. The cost for the program is \$299.

Each Venture School team will be assigned a local entrepreneur as their coach. Participating teams will be eligible to compete for cash awards both locally and at the state level during the Venture School launch day at EntreFEST 2023. Last year's Mason City graduates were awarded \$8,000 in prize money during the 2023 EntreFEST pitch competition.

State Legislative Session

The November elections made an impact on the composition of the state legislature, which convenes this month. Governor Kim Reynolds won her race for re-election by garnering nearly 60% of the vote. Republicans in the Iowa Senate expanded their majority from 32 to 34, and Iowa House Republicans also expanded their majority.

Sen. Jack Whitver was re-elected to the Majority Leader post and Sen. Amy Sinclair was elected by her caucus to serve as Senate President. Rep. Pat Grassley was re-elected to serve as Speaker of the House, and Rep. Matt Windschitl will serve as Majority Leader. Rep. Henry Stone from North Iowa will serve as the new Majority Whip. Mason City's Rep. Sharon Steckman was elected by House Democrats as Assistant Minority Leader.

North Iowa will be represented by Sen. Waylon Brown, Rep. Sharon Steckman, Rep. Shannon Latham, and Rep. Jane Bloomingdale.
