North Iowa Civics Bee - April 25

For the second year, the Chamber is hosting the North Iowa Civics Bee in partnership with the U.S. Chamber of Commerce Foundation. This year, the Civics Bee in Mason City will be one of five regional bees happening in lowa, with the top three students moving on to the Iowa Civics Bee taking place at the Iowa State Fair.

The National Civics Bee is an annual competition that encourages young Americans to engage in civics and contribute to their communities. Participating middle school students will flex their civics knowledge for a chance to win recognition and cash prizes – including a \$500 cash prize for the winner of the local bee, and a \$1000 cash prize for the winner of the state bee.

Dozens of middle school students in North Iowa have submitted qualifying essays that are now being scored by a panel of judges. The top twenty students will move on to compete in a live event on Tuesday, April 25 in the FEMA Room at Mason City High School. NORTH IOWA CORRIDOR EDC'S BRE PROGRAM

One of the most important efforts of the North Iowa Corridor is our Business Retention and Expansion (BRE) program. The North Iowa Corridor is committed to assisting and supporting existing large business within the region and this program continues to be a lead objective in the organization's overall strategic plan. Regular visits with existing large business assists in getting a better understanding of how critical and valuable they are to our local economy.

The BRE program is used to identify opportunities for growth and any impediment that discourage local expansion. Shaun Arneson, Vice President, Existing Business and Project Management said "Based on research, existing business and industry account for over 70% or more of new jobs and capital investment. It is important that we show our appreciation for their investment and contribution to our regional economy and be a resource for them to remain competitive in our global economy".

Arneson and other North Iowa Corridor staff conduct in-depth interviews annually with area major employers in manufacturing, ag-related and service-related business in the region to gather information. The same questionnaire will be used for each company visit to help identify individual business needs, concerns and suggestions about the local business climate. The North Iowa Corridor has conducted these interviews for the past several years and it allows the Corridor to gain invaluable insight into the dynamics of the local economy.

Any and all company information gathered is kept strictly confidential and results will be in aggregate form. A report with aggregated results will be compiled to the participating companies which will eventually track trends over time.

THE NORTH IOWA JOINT COMPREHENSIVE PLAN

The City of Clear Lake, the City of Mason City, and Cerro Gordo County are planning together to encourage growth and develop beneficial policies with the North Iowa Joint Comprehensive Plan.

A comprehensive plan is a long-range plan for determining a community's goals and can guide development, growth, service, and preservation. This plan will help develop policies and guidelines for future development and planning efforts. The final plan will help coordinate goals to create one cohesive community.

The 2023 John Pappajohn Entrepreneurial Venture Competition

The 2023 John Pappajohn Iowa Entrepreneurial Venture Competition will open for applications in March. The eighteenth annual statewide competition will award \$100,000 in cash prizes to lowa startups and entrepreneurial ventures. The \$100,000 in seed funding includes a \$50,000 contribution from John and Mary Pappajohn, matched by \$50,000 from the Iowa Economic Development Authority (IEDA). The goal of this competition is to support lowa's entrepreneurial ecosystem by assisting entrepreneurs.

lowa businesses that have been in operation for four years or less, or are not yet cash flow positive, are eligible to apply. This competition is open to businesses including, but not limited to, technology, bio-technology, green technologies, medical, advanced manufacturing, agriculture, engineering, and education industries.

Participants will be judged first on their written submissions, and, those who advance to the final round of the competition, will give a formal presentation to a panel of judges. First place will be awarded \$40,000, second place \$25,000, and third place \$15,000. Awards for other honorable mention categories will total up to \$20,000. The competition is a collaborative project of the Iowa John Pappajohn Entrepreneurial Centers located at Drake University, Iowa State University, North Iowa Area Community College, the University of Iowa, and the University of Northern Iowa.

In 2022, three entrepreneurs working with the NIACC Pappajohn Center made it to the final round: Mitchell Hora of Continuum Ag (Washington, IA) who won the First Place prize of \$40,000; Jayson Ryner of ReEnvision Ag (Nora Springs, IA) who won an Honorable Mention prize of \$5,000; and Jill Ihrke of Easy2Show (Sheffield, IA) who won an Honorable Mention prize of \$2,000.
