Sara has a very interesting practice: she has formed her own personal Board of Directors. This isn't a loose term she uses for her mentors. She deliberately asked a small group of leaders, whom she trusts and admires, to be part of her Personal Board of Directors. She counts on them for honest feedback on difficult decisions, big or small. In fact, that is one of her only asks of them – that they be brutally honest – and in turn, she promises to willingly accept their feedback.

Rowena offered some insight into the challenge of moving from being an employee (or if you are a small business owner, from being a staff of one) into a leadership position. Generally speaking, what got you to that leadership role is your expertise in a specific field: you do something really well. The irony is, when you move from "doer" to "leader," you likely are no longer actively engaged in the thing you do so well. You are supervising others, while also juggling the new responsibilities that come with leadership. Essentially, you have to learn to let go in order to grow.




Travel to Peru with the Chamber

PROTECTING THE DESIGN OF HISTORIC DOWNTOWN

Downtown Mason City is a beautiful and vital cultural resource. Maintaining its character is essential in keeping Downtown the historic and cultural heart of the city. The construction of a pole building and painting the side of a historic building with bright red paint in the early 2000s led the Downtown Association (the precursor to Main Street Mason City) to request that the City adopt regulations to preserve Downtown's historic character. In 2004, the Zoning Ordinance was amended to state that original exterior building materials on Downtown buildings, such as brick, stone, or punched metal, could not be covered with artificial materials (such as EIFS) or be painted. Some buildings had been covered or painted prior to when the new rules were adopted, and were thus "grandfathered in." In 2006, the Downtown National Register Historic District was designated, and several significant buildings were noted as "contributing" to the historic character of the district. There are also individual buildings that are listed on the National Register of Historic Places, such the City National Bank/Historic Park Inn, the Kirk Apartments, and the Brick and Tile Building.

These amendments for the downtown zoning district are so that owners know what they can and cannot change of their building's physical appearance. Keeping our registered historic places in their best original condition is the goal of this ordinance. This is not to say no changes can ever be made, just that the application of façade materials cannot alter the historic character of the building, and some specific materials are prohibited from use. The Historic Preservation Commission can be an asset to building owners if they are looking for an innovative and cost-effective solution to preserving their important piece of history.

NORTH IOWA CORRIDOR EDC CELEBRATES ANOTHER YEAR OF GROWTH AND PROSPERITY

The North Iowa Corridor Economic Development Corporation EDC held its 2023 annual meeting on Thursday June 22nd at the Historic Surf Ballroom in Clear Lake. The event was attended by more than 125 local leaders, investors, officials, and partners who came to hear about the achievements and challenges of the past year and the plans and goals for the future.

Bob Klocke, the outgoing chair of the EDC board, welcomed the guests and recognized the special guests and elected officials in attendance. He also thanked the board members for their service and presented plaques to the retiring board members: Scott Smed, Christy Marchand, Rod Schlader, and Mark Ebeling.

Klocke gave a recap of the past year, including the focus on key areas such as workforce development, business retention and expansion, regional collaboration, and marketing and promotion. Klocke also mentioned some of the challenges that the region faced, primarily workforce needs and housing availability that the Corridor is actively working to address through various initiatives and partnerships.

Klocke invited guests to the first North Iowa Rural Development Summit, an exciting event sponsored by the Corridor, NIACC, and First Citizens Bank. Leaders from across the North Central Iowa will gather August 17 at the Mason City Arena to learn how they can work together to address issues for the benefit of all our region's communities. Rural Economist Dr. David Kohl will keynote the event, and lead panel discussions including IEDA Director Debi Durham and State of Iowa USDA Director Theresa Greenfield, as well as a panel of local leaders. Kent Brcka, the incoming chair of the EDC board, also made remarks about the upcoming year. Brcka said he was excited to lead the board and continue the momentum. He also provided a tribute to the many public and private investors in the Corridor's mission, noting the increased support from both sectors this year. Brcka welcomed and introduced the new board members: Chris Lovell CLTel, Susan Sabin Stellar Industries, Becky Schwab Short Elliott Hendrickson Inc., and Scott Curtis MercyOne North Iowa.

Charlie Cowell, a partner at RDG Planning & Design provided the keynote speech on the event's theme "Destination North Iowa". RDG is leading the joint comprehensive plan being done by the Cities of Mason City and Clear Lake and Cerro Gordo County to guide the long-term planning for the region's future growth and prosperity.

He explained the purpose, process, and topics of the plan, and how it will create a shared vision based on public input and data analysis. He also shared some of the common themes and priorities that emerged from the input sessions, such as community appearance, housing, recreation, and workforce. He encouraged the audience to participate in the online survey and interactive map on the project website, and said he expects the plan to be completed by later this year.

The event concluded with a thank you note from Chad Schreck, the President and CEO of the EDC. Schreck thanked all the attendees for their support and involvement in the economic development of North Iowa. He also thanked the staff of the EDC for their hard work and dedication. The recent New Energy Freedom project announcement of a \$350m investment is a great indicator of the region's strength in bio-fuels and agriculture, and hopes to share more exciting news soon. He noted that there are hundreds of housing units planned or in development for the next 2 years. He said he was proud of what the EDC had accomplished in the past year and optimistic about what it could achieve in the future.

NIACC Pappajohn Center hosts the 2023 Youth **Entrepreneurial Academy**

The NIACC John Pappajohn Entrepreneurial Center conducted the 2023 Youth Entrepreneurial Academy (YEA) on June 12-16. YEA is a free one-week academic camp sponsored by the John K. and Luise V. Hanson Foundation, and is offered annually to all North Iowa high school students interested in entrepreneurship. Each participant receives a \$500 NIACC scholarship sponsored by the late John Pappajohn.

Throughout the week-long camp, the twelve aspiring entrepreneurs worked diligently to develop a business model canvas. Students had the opportunity to network with local entrepreneurs, develop leadership skills, and gain fundamental skills required when starting a business. On Tuesday, June 20, the students pitched

their business ideas by submitting an executive summary that included a company description, financial plans, and business model key measures that included startup costs and sales projections. The students competed against their peers for a total of \$2,600 in cash prizes.

The Academy's director and mentor was Kelley O'Rourke, School Partnership Entrepreneurial Coordinator at the Pappajohn Center. The facilitator was Candi Karsjens, Pappajohn Center Director, and Ashley Page, Director of Entrepreneurship Programs & Client Success at the Pappajohn Center. Guest speakers for the week included Joyce Martin, Pappajohn Center Marketing and Community Relations Manager; Stacy Doughan, President & CEO of the Clear Lake Area Chamber of Commerce; Brad and Angie Barber, Cabin Coffee; and Jayson Ryner, ReEnvision Ag and NIACC instructor.

The students presented their businesses to a panel of three judges: Hunter Callanan; Beth Bilyeu, Forest City Economic Development Corporation; and Brook Boehmler, North Iowa Area SBDC. The judges chose three businesses to win the top prizes, with two honorable mention prizes of \$250, and six honorable mention prizes of \$100. The winners were:
