IOWA PBS HIGHLIGHTS HISTORIC BUILDINGS OF MASON CITY & CLEAR LAKE

Mason City and Clear Lake were recently the focus of Iowa PBS's hour-long documentary "Historic Buildings of Iowa: Mason City and Clear Lake." The latest installment of the network's architecture program premiered online and on air on Saturday, November 18 at 3:30 p.m. as part of Fall Festival 2023. It was rebroadcast on November 19th and November 27th.

"lowa PBS Senior Producer and Director Tyler Brinegar mentioned, "Mason City offers one of the best collections of architecture in the Midwest, if not the country. It was a thrill to film these unique designs, and we're excited to share the history behind them with lowans."

The documentary highlighted buildings such as:

- The Historic Park Inn Hotel and City National Bank, the only standing inn designed by the famous architect Frank Lloyd Wright.
- The Stockman House, the third iteration of Frank

- Lloyd Wright's Fireproof House.
- The Rock Crest-Rock Glen Historic District, the largest collection of prairie school architecture in a natural setting.
- The Joshua Melson House, a two-story ashlar-style home set into a cliff that looks like it's growing out of the rock.
- The Music Man Square and Meredith Willson Boyhood Home.
- The Charles H. MacNider Art Museum, a former convent turned art museum, free to the public.
- The Surf Ballroom, a place where rock 'n' roll lives on, long after the day the music died.

The State of North Iowa 2024

The 2024 State of North Iowa will feature keynote presentations on some of the region's most pressing subjects: workforce attraction, renewable fuels, and childcare.

Scheduled from 8-10AM on Thursday, January 18, the State of North Iowa will be held in the Muse-Norris Conference Center at NIACC. This year's presenters include Debi Durham, Director of the Iowa Economic Development Authority and Iowa Finance Authority; Monte Shaw, Executive Director of the Iowa Renewable Fuels Association; and Sheri Penney, Employment Engagement Director at the Iowa Women's Foundation.



Durham will kick off the event with a keynote discussion about lowa's economy. Attendees will learn about the state's highlights and challenges in workforce attraction and business investment. Durham will also share details about a new national workforce recruitment campaign that North lowa is helping to pilot.

Shaw will provide an update on the renewable fuels industry in the state and, more specifically, in North Iowa. There are several major projects and opportunities in the works that will have a major impact on the region, and Chad Schreck, North Iowa Corridor President & CEO, will provide insight into what these look like and why North Iowa is seen as a renewable fuels hub.

Finally, attendees will hear about the Child Care Works initiative launching January 1, 2024 in Cerro Gordo County. Sheri Penney will provide an update on the wage supplement program, which is launching in 12 communities statewide, aims to address the child care crisis. She will also share other ways the state is working to ensure all kids have access to reliable, quality child care, and what is still needed.

In 2021, Mason City hosted the inaugural National Civics Bee, sponsored by the US Chamber of Commerce Foundation. This year, the initiative has expanded to more than 100 local Civics Bees in 26 states! The program aims to increase literacy about American civic life. The Civics Bee is designed to give young Americans a taste of how they can contribute and participate in our government process.

The **North Iowa Civics Bee** will take place at 1PM on April 2 at the Mason City FEMA Room, with the finalists moving on to the Iowa Civics Bee. The winner at the state level will compete in the first National Civics Bee in Washington, DC.

Students from across North Iowa are invited to participate. Entrants will write a short essay (500 words or less) about an issue or opportunity they see in their community and how they would use civics to address it. Participants learn to overcome the chaos and uncertainty of creating new ventures by conducting customer discovery, market research and developing their foundational business model in real-time.

The NIACC Pappajohn Center is now accepting applications for the Spring 2024 cohort of the University of Iowa Venture School program. 

Building CommUNITY

orth Iowa demographics are changing. The recent Census may not show a large change, but school systems in the area tell a different story. In 2023, Mason City Community Schools show 28% of the student population is non-white students.

For the past year, the Chamber has been focused on welcoming all people to the community. Those of a different race, with different religious beliefs, gender preferences, abilities, and ages, to name a few. Workforce attraction and retention continues to be a priority in the Chamber's program of work to help achieve economic growth and prosperity for residents. North lowa needs people of ALL kinds in order to grow.



While diversity, equity, and inclusion are all important components of this movement, the Chamber's workforce committee is shifting its focus to simply "Building CommUNITY." What can North lowans do to make the community more welcoming so newcomers feel a sense of belonging and inclusion...and what does that look like?

In a recent **Building CommUNITY** workshop, participants discussed barriers and ideas for individuals, workplaces, and the community. They discussed belonging, trainings, and what could be implemented in their workplaces to help move the needle on inclusion. There are a lot of possibilities in this space, but here are some suggestions the Chamber heard on how to help facilitate the effort:

- 1. Be persistent Keep offering programming. It's an important effort and businesses see the value, even if they are slow to adapt.
- 2. Direct people to assistance Businesses and individuals in the community need resources and answers.
- 3. Make a business case for **Building CommUNITY** Show how this effort can help with staff morale and employee retention.

The Chamber's Workforce Committee will continue to adapt as needed to ensure businesses see the value in **Building CommUNITY**. Together, North lowans can all work to build a place of pride, safety, and belonging.



CORRIDOR ASSUMES HISTORIC EGLOFF HOUSE OPERATIONS TO PROVIDE SHORT-TERM FURNISHED HOUSING

Members of Community Benefit-Mason City, the organization responsible for the rescue and restoration of the Historic Egloff House, have transferred ownership and ongoing management of the property to the North Iowa Corridor Economic Development Corporation.

Since 2021, the house has operated as short-term furnished housing for local business college interns, graduate students, and new employees needing transitional housing when moving to the community. This use aligns with the Corridor's workforce attraction and retention strategies on behalf of local firms and provides an important service to our businesses.

Members of the Corridor board of directors are committed to maintaining the Historic Egloff House as a community asset and amenity for businesses. The home has 5 private bedrooms available for rent for \$650-\$750 monthly. Businesses have often offered it as a perk for interns or new employees.

The home is fully furnished, with many original pieces to the home, creating a unique and inviting atmosphere. Tenants have shared living spaces and a full kitchen, just a short walk from the restaurants, breweries, and other amenities of downtown Mason City. The group-living situation connects tenants to the community and one another, enriching their experience in North lowa.

Room Sponsorship opportunities are available, which will provide annual naming rights to the room, as well as first rights to the room for business use that year. This will be an important way to ensure the ongoing success and viability of the operation, and we welcome interested parties to contact Chad Schreck at the Corridor to discuss sponsorship or rental options.



According to Corridor President & CEO Chad Schreck, the house is filling a significant workforce need. "Workforce attraction is critical for our businesses, and we strive to provide solutions to make it easier for them to choose our community. The home provides a comfortable, welcoming environment for prospective employees, and we hope plays a role in them choosing to stay long-term," he said.

The Historic Egloff House is listed on the National Register of Historic Places, and was a victim of the 2008 flood and was slated for demolition. Community Benefit-Mason City, a local non-profit, stepped forward to move the house from the flood zone and restore it to its original glory. In addition to renovating the Egloff House, the group transformed the 300 block of East State Street from a blighted neighborhood to an area which enhances Mason City's architectural reputation.

CBMC member Dan Robeson noted, "The EDC is the perfect partner to promote the use of the house for workforce attraction and oversee day-to-day operations. Our organization is entirely run by four volunteers that are unable to manage this property long-term. We are thankful to the Mason City Chamber and Chamber Foundation for all they have done to keep this project going. We are proud of the effort, and excited to see it continue to operate for the benefit of North lowa."
