2024 TOURISM LEGISLATIVE PRIORITIES

The 90th General Assembly of the Iowa Legislature is now underway, and Visit Mason City is once again partnering with tourism advocates across the state to champion issues crucial to Iowa's tourism industry.

In recent years, there has been a substantial increase in funds dedicated to fueling growth and development in communities throughout lowa, with a particular emphasis on boosting tourism initiatives. Projects like Bike North Iowa and the Surf District have directly benefited from this surge in appropriations.

The impact of these investments is evident in the numbers, with visitor spending in 2022 reaching an impressive \$6.9 billion—a remarkable 13% increase compared to the previous year. Locally, the direct visitor spending impact of \$78.04 million generated a total economic impact of \$116.34 million in Mason City in 2022 including indirect and induced impacts.

Guided by the Iowa Travel Industry Partners (iTIP), our legislative priorities for 2024 are laser-focused:

- 1) Maintain Support for Tourism Initiatives: This includes steadfast support for the Iowa Tourism Office, Destination Iowa, Sports Tourism Fund, Community Attraction & Tourism (CAT), Meet in Iowa, and Community Placemaking Efforts.
- 2) Sustain Funding & Enhance Regional Sports Authority Districts.
- **3) Maintain Iowa's School Start Date Law:** We advocate for maintaining Iowa's current school start date law of August 23, enabling the tourism industry to generate revenue for the state.
- **4) Support Alternate Funding Sources for Tourism:** This involves advocating for the enactment of IWILL and water quality initiatives that allocate funding for tourism and quality of life components, alongside exploring other alternative funding sources.





Throughout the legislative session, our dedicated VMC team will actively engage in discussions with lowa's elected officials to underscore the pivotal role tourism plays in lowa's economy. We extend an invitation to YOU to join us in amplifying our voices and emphasizing the significance of tourism.

North Iowa Civics Bee

The U.S. Chamber Foundation has extended the deadline for students to enter the National Civics Bee! Middle school students in North Iowa have until Monday, February 19 to qualify for this exciting event.

Entrants will write a short essay (500 words or less) about an issue or opportunity they see in their community and how they would use civics to address it. Then, judges will choose the top 20 students to participate in the live *North Iowa Civics Bee* on April 2 at the Mason City FEMA Room. The finalists from the local bee will continue on to the Iowa Civics Bee, and the winner at the state level will compete in the first National Civics Bee in Washington, D.C.

In 2021, Mason City hosted the inaugural National Civics Bee, sponsored by the US Chamber of Commerce Foundation. This year, the initiative has expanded to more than 100 local Civics Bees in 26 states! The program aims to increase literacy about American civic life and give young Americans a taste of how they can contribute and participate in our government process.
